Report on Tender Evaluation for Tenders to provide play equipment at Osbourne Road play area Summary

1. Introduction

Following a Council decision [minute C 072/16], invitations to tender were sent to 4 suppliers of play equipment on 1st August 2016 for the design, supply and installation of play equipment for Osbourne Road play area [Appendix 1]. Two submissions were received by the due date of 30th August 2016 and considered by a Tender Panel on Friday 14th October 2016.

2 Tender Panel

The Tender Panel was made up of four councillors, one representing St Boisil ward, which is the ward Osbourne Road play area is in, and three others. The councillors on the panel were Councillors Gibson [St Boisil ward], Hodgson, McLean, and Graham. BTC's Finance officer acted as secretary to the panel.

3 Tender Evaluation Criteria

Initially, tenders were assessed for compliance with the check list supplied. Additionally, the tenders were assessed on the design layout proposed, including the suitability for the target age range, the individual play items, any additional furniture included, safety surface [type and extent] and cost.

- 4 Tender Evaluation Results
- 4.1 Checklist: Both suppliers provided all the information requested within the submitted tenders.
- 4.2 Design: Both designs were similar in layout and equipment types suggested. Both were considered broadly suitable for the target age range, albeit with some reservations regarding the climbing frame proposed by supplier 1. The design provided by supplier 2 was thought to be more colourful as it incorporated coloured surface treatments.
- 4.3 Individual Play Items: Both proposals included similar basic play items; swings, springers, see-saw, roundabout, slide and climbing frame. In addition to the reservations about the climbing frame proposed by supplier 1, felt to be too old for the target age group, the panel also had reservations about the suggest style of roundabout and see-saw. There were no similar reservations regarding the play items suggested by supplier 2, with the climbing frame design seen as particularly suitable. The 'wide' slide to allow side by side sliding was also noted.
- 4.4 Additional Furniture: Neither submission included any non-play items
- 4.5 Safety Surface: The current play area is tarmac with safety surface surrounding the play equipment. Both suppliers proposed to use a wet pour safety surface. Supplier 1 proposed that the new safety surface would cover a similar area, while supplier 2 proposed to additionally remove areas of tarmac and replace these with safety surface.
- 4.6 Cost: the cost of the scheme proposed by Supplier 1 was 13% higher than that proposed by Supplier 2

5 Conclusions & Recommendation

Having considered all aspects of both tenders, the panel concluded that the proposal from Supplier 2 represented the better design and combination of play items. Together with the greater area of safety surface and lower price, the panel concluded this proposal represented best value for money.

Therefore, the panel would recommend BTC accept the tender from Supplier 2 at a cost of £34987.20.

On Saturday 1st October our town was invaded by an organised gang of racists and fascists. The public were protected from them by the Northumberland Police, but they were still allowed to chant racist slogans and intimidate residents.

Of particular note is that Nazi salutes were made in our Town, and they were taken by the Police to the Church were in a few weeks time we will be remembering the millions of people who gave their lives to keep our country free of these sort of people. These actions by the self-styled 'Northern Infidels' and 'Scottish Defence League' insulted our war dead and they defiled their sacrifice. Also present were members of highly unpleasant organisation known as 'Direct Action' who are openly racist, and style their emblem on the Nazi SS.

I myself am a 3rd generation immigrant, as my grandparents were refugees who were given sanctuary in this country. Many other Berwick residents are no doubt the descendants of refugees and immigrants. If you go back far enough we are all immigrants. There is a large Polish community living in Berwick, who contribute to our economy. We ought to be taken our fair share of sheltering refugees from the war zones that surround Europe today.

I would like Berwick Town Council to consider the following resolution at its earliest opportunity Berwick Town Council believes that racism has no place in our town, and that the supporters of race hatred are not welcome here.

The Town Council resolves to write to the Northumberland Chief of Police and Police Commissioner to answer the following questions

- 1. Why was this march not banned?
- 2. Why were none of the marchers arrested for incitement to race hatred?
- 3. Why were Nazi salutes allowed, and the racists allowed to march past the Church were we will be remembering our war dead in just over 4 weeks time?

We also request that all further political marches are banned as they constitute a breach of the peace.


