What does your organisation do?									
Berwick Rangers Community Foundation (BRCF) is a relatively new charity, but having been constituted just prior to Covid, is only just getting going now. As an addendum to the figures above, now that we are post-Covid, the charity has raised almost £2,000 from donations in recent months.									
The charity is completely separate from the namesake club constitutionally, but works in conjunction with them and also with the separate charity of Berwick Rangers Juniors.									
BRCF's vision is to work in active partnership with Berwick Rangers Football Club, volunteers, supporters, stakeholders and residents in Berwick, North Northumberland and the eastern Borders to encourage sustainable participation in football, other sport and community wellbeing initiatives. As well as creating the best possible opportunities on the pitch, the activities of the Foundation will help support and improve the lives of people in the area in many ways beyond football.									
BRCF currently has an agreement in place with Berwick Rangers Juniors that sees the two organisations working together to deliver and grow junior football provision in the town. And it is also working with professional coaches from the Grey and Gold Soccer Academy to deliver quality football training for 5-7 year-olds at the Sports Centre.

This project is to help fund a quality training and development programme for adult coaching volunteers.

BRCF are currently running a partnership with football coaching company 'Gold and Gray' which was founded by two ex-Berwick Rangers players, to coach 5-7 year-old boys and girls prior to their entry into Berwick Rangers Juniors and Wildcats (and others) football programmes.

Why is it needed? (include details of any research you have carried out to identify the need and describe any specific benefits for the people of Berwick, Tweedmouth and Spittal)

To improve the volume and quality of opportunities for junior football in Berwick it is important that sufficient adult coaching volunteers are engaged and trained.

Lack of coaches is a perennial problem and a log-jam for junior football in Berwick (as it is in many other places) and is a constraining factor that, if solved, would allow more boys, and increasingly girls, to enjoy the health and wellbeing benefits of playing football.

As part of BRCF's partnership with Berwick Rangers Juniors, we aim to have more and better coaches in place to allow for expansion across teams and age groups of both boys' and girls' football.

This will be facilitated via a project delivered by the Gold and Grey Soccer Academy.

A professional coach-the-coaches training and development programme will be delivered in Berwick on a weekly basis over the 2022/23 winter.

How will you measure the success of your project?

Ultimately, more teams and more kids playing football and being coached well in subsequent seasons.

The quality of Berwick's junior football coaches is difficult to measure in the short-term, but Ultimately, we hope to see a 20% increase in the number of local coaches achieving a formal qualification.
